


RSAP 2003-2010

Policy Orientations- Main elements

- Main elements of Policy Orientations
- Primary Target another -/- 50 % deaths in traffic
- -> Education, training and enforcement are considered essential.



POLICY Objectives

7 Objectives have been identified

- 1. Improve education and training of road users
- 2. Increase enforcement of road rules
- 3. Safer road infrastructure
- 4. Safer vehicles
- 5. Promote the use of modern technology to increase safety
- 6. Improve emergency and post-injury services
- 7. Protect vulnerable road users



Objective 1 Education and training – Common Strategy

- Commission will develop a new common strategy on education and training
- In co-operation with Member States, experts and Stakeholders as CIECA
- Involves improvement and extension of current legislation on Driving licences and CPC
 - + exchange of best practices



How to improve education and training of road users

- **Pre-test learning**: promote practice before the test under maximum safety conditions
 - e.g. accompanied driving
 - harmonised minimum requirements for instructors and accompanying drivers

Driving licence test:

- highway code
- manoeuvres
- -> broader driving skills/risk awareness/ defensive driving/ eco-driving

Post-licence training

- Continuous training for non-professional drivers to be examined



Planning Education & Training

Short term (2011-2012):

- Priority is Driving licence Directive 2006/126/EC

- Preparatory work for future development education and training strategy (CIECA)



Planning Education & Training

Medium and long term (2013-2020)

- <u>Proposing amendments</u> to Directive/ legislative proposals on training and testing for licence
- Actions to develop post-licence and life-long learning through exchange best-practices, or guidelines
- <u>Negotiating and adopting amendments</u> to the Directive concerning training requirements instructors, accompanied driving, etc
- Preparation <u>comprehensive legislative package</u> on education, training and testing



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 Objective n°5: Promote the use of modern technology to increase road safety

Modern technology – training and testing:

- Assistance: e-learning, simulators
- Concerns: how to train and test on vehicles with more and more ITS



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Objective n°7: Protect vulnerable road users

- High number of fatalities and serious injuries for this group is concern for Commission
- PTW, AM, Bicycles, Elderly, Pedestrians, disabled persons are overpopulated in fatalities

Actions

The European Commission will discuss their approach with stakeholders

The Commission:


- Appreciates CIECA's activities so far in helping to support the legislative framework and provide non-legislative solutions
