Current status of transposition of the progressive access rules

• Today

AM, A1, A restricted, and A unrestricted

- Planned to 2013 (work in progress)
 Introducing of A2 instead of A restricted, which expires
- From 2013 (no decisions yet)
 AM A1 A2 A





Driving licence category AM from October 1, 2009

- Age 15
- Learners permit including a health declaration



- Compulsory education; theoretical and practical exercises including driving in traffic. (Minimum time: 12 hours included 4 hours of practical training)
- Theory test (no driving test)
- Possibility to withdraw the driving licence





Special arrangements for mopeds with more than 2 wheels and special provisions for physically disabled persons who wish to ride mopeds

- Category AM is valid for mopeds with 3 or 4 wheels
- If the learners permit is restricted to vehicles with three or four wheels, such a vehicle can be used during the AM training (otherwise two-wheels)
- Physically disabled persons may have vehicle adaptation
- Licences granted for any other category shall be valid for vehicles in category AM





Are electric motor mopeds/quads becoming an issue?

- Electric motors are allowed (max 4 kW)
 Other limitations are discussed, but nothing decided yet
- You can drive four-wheeled mopeds if you have a license for AM
 But during the training you must have a twowheeled moped, if your learners permit is not restricted to vehicles with three or four wheels.
- With such a restriction code on the licence, you are not allowed to drive two wheeled mopeds.



Special arrangements for motorcycles with more than 2 wheels (from 2013)

- Discussions are ongoing (no decisions yet) Sweden's current proposal is:
- B1 will not be introduced.
 Category B, valid for motorcycles with 3 or 4 wheels (21years for 3 wheels)



- Category A, valid for motorcycles with 2 or 3 wheels (today even 4-wheels if they are motorcycles)
 - 16 years for tricycles not exceeding 15 kW
 - 21 years for tricycles exceeding 15 kW
- Physically disabled persons may have vehicle adaptation



Training or testing on the qualifying event in progressive access? And what's the reason?

Sweden's current proposal is a practical test including driving in traffic (no decisions yet)

- Passing licensing tests is the traditional Swedish model how to achieve a driving licence (all categories)
- A driving test only is seen as enough for progressive access. This possibility is only for those who already have a license for a motorcycle in a lower category

A good driving test requires good training on the larger vehicle



No training route for the qualifying event in progressive access, but

We have recently (November 1, 2009) introduced mandatory risk education for motorcyclists.

At least 3 hours theoretical education and at least 4 hours practical education.

For progressive access to higher categories risk education will be mandatory, if such education is not completed for a lower category.





Direct access arrangements for category A (unrestricted)?

<u>To day</u>

- 21 years or older (theoretical and practical test)
- 20 years automatically if two years with an A restricted (No test)

<u>2013</u>

- 24 years or older (theoretical and practical test)
- 20 years if two years experience of A2 (Practical Test only)





Particular issues with the specifications for motorcycles used for the practical test?

- We will probably propose that the specifications for motorcycles will be introduced in line with the directive 2013.
- Probably we will adjust the specification for category A unrestricted already in 2011 (but still in line with the 2nd directive)



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
